Changing practice: reducing the risk

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Research suggests that 50% of people with learning disabilities and challenging behaviour are subject to physical interventions (Emerson et al, 2000). It is also the case that any use of physical intervention has inherent risk to both service users, staff and organisations or services that support people with a learning disability. Indeed the 'joint guidance' identifies six types of intervention that should be considered to have an elevated level of risk.

In 2004 the National Patient Safety Agency identified that people with learning disabilities were at risk and priority number one in the document; 'Understanding the patient safety issue for people with learning disabilities was the inappropriate use of physical interventions'.

Ethical and legal issues relating to the use of physical interventions in the care settings where the needs of sustaining a therapeutic relationship must be balanced with the duty of care, the safety of staff and best interests of individual service users, are also linked to risk.

Inappropriate or poor training which places emphasis on physical skills rather than preventative behaviour support and change strategies can lead to both an increase in the use of physical interventions and of their use with no reference to individual support plans, risk assessment or positive behaviour change strategies.

Allen (2001) suggests that successful interventions involve, firstly, behaviour change strategies and, secondly, behaviour management strategies to maintain support for people with a learning disability and challenging behaviour. It is further suggested by Paley (2006) that a strategic approach to risk management will benefit both service users and organisations that support them.

We have come a long way but there is still a great deal more we need to do to ensure that practice continues to improve, that our knowledge relating to risk involved in physical interventions is increased and that the service users receive the service they deserve. This conference is a key event in the calendar for a multi-disciplinary audience and aims, through a selection of topical keynote speakers, workshops and debating sessions, to highlight some of the good practices and ongoing challenges in the field of behaviour support and physical interventions.
