Experiencing domestic abuse can have long lasting and damaging effects upon a person, leaving them with painful and overwhelming emotions. An estimated three million children in the UK are exposed to violence in the home. *Beyond Violence: breaking cycles of domestic abuse*, a new report from the Centre of Social Justice says children caught up in domestic violence are at greater risk of mental health, behavioural and educational problems and more likely to become a perpetrator or victim of violence themselves in adulthood. Breaking these ‘cycles of violence’ should be a priority for the Government and for society in general. This seminar will consider the impact of domestic violence on children with learning disabilities and look at treatment options offered by Respond’s Young People’s Therapy Service.

This seminar also aims to shine a light on the intersection of learning disabilities and domestic abuse, including the complex issue of forced marriage and learning disabilities. The seminar will also suggest ways to support both children and adults with learning disabilities affected by these

This seminar will focus on domestic abuse and the forced marriage of people with learning disabilities

- We will look at how best to support children and adults with learning disabilities, their families and the people that work with them
- We will look at the impact that working with domestic abuse can have on practitioners.

- Attendees will feel more confident about how to support people with learning disabilities
