Implementing the Mental Capacity Act

The focus of the event will be on providing practical skills and strategies in implementing the Mental Capacity Act for people with learning disabilities with complex needs. This will include addressing issues of communication and how to involve individuals in making choices and decisions.

The practical challenges to making the Act work for individuals will be explored in detail and the opportunity to problem solve around such issues will be provided.

During day 1 participants will complete a "Personal Action Plan", to turn policy into practice at their workplace. This will then be followed up on day 2 of the event to share what has worked well, what has proved more difficult and how to overcome any barriers to implementing the Act in the future. This is a unique opportunity for participants to tailor the programme for day 2 to meet their specific needs.

Aims and outcomes – Day 1

- To reflect on the impact of the Mental Capacity Act 2005 on people with complex needs
- To identify the expectations on those offering support
- To equip participants with the tools and confidence to implement the Act within their organisation

Aims and outcomes – Day 2

- To deliver a 'bespoke' day for each group of participants – this will look at what has worked well for them in terms of implementing their personal action plan in their work place
- To highlight some of the barriers to effective implementation of their action plan and try to problem solve around these.

Who should attend

Anyone who directly supports and works with people with learning disabilities and complex needs as well as specialist health professionals, advocacy workers, managers of service provision (health and social care), social workers/learning disability community nurses.
