Having an MRI Scan




You are coming for an MRI scan.

At the main reception someone can show you the way to the x-ray department.



You should have a card or letter to bring with you.



Give your card or letter to the receptionist.



You can sit in the waiting room until it is your turn.



You will fill in a safety questionnaire.

You may need an injection in your arm or the back of your hand.


This is to help get better pictures.



Shelley at reception




	You will change into a gown.

	The radiographers leave the room but they can see you through a window.
	They can hear you and speak too.
	Nothing touches you and it does not hurt.
	You do need to keep as still as you can though.

Your scan may last around 30 minutes.



You need to lie on a table.



The scanner is noisy so you will wear some headphones.




You will be given a buzzer to use if you are worried.
