Developed with Macmillan Cancer these images can be used to make your own accessible information such as posters, leaflets and personalised care plans. The CD-Rom also includes "We are Living Well but Dying Matters" which is a film made by CHANGE and with support from The National Council of Palliative Care. In the film people with learning disabilities tell their stories and share their wishes to support other people with learning disabilities to become more comfortable talking about dying, death and bereavement.
