ACCESS TO HEALTHCARE FOR PEOPLE WITH LEARNING DISABILITIES (NUR206)

New, Web-based Module for ALL Health Care Professionals

Who is the module for?

This module is for all health care professionals, but particularly for those whose work brings them into contact with people with learning disabilities who need health care.

Why is it needed?

There is a need to improve access to healthcare services for people who have a learning disability, by offering education for practitioners in mainstream health services.

What does the module cover?

The module examines the health needs of people who have learning disabilities and addresses equality issues in relation to the delivery of healthcare. Barriers to access to healthcare are examined and arrangements to facilitate access will be studied in depth in the context of the student's own practice environment.

How is the module delivered?

The module is presented in a predominantly web-based distance learning format. Attendance at the University is not required, and support can be provided for IT training if necessary.

What's the credit value?

The module is at SCQF Level 9 with 22 credit points. It can be taken as a free-standing module or integrated into a programme of study.

The module may also be taken as a non-assessed unit of study.
