The Assessment of Risk and Manageability of Intellectually Disabled Individuals who Offend - Sexually

The Assessment of Risk and Manageability of Intellectually Disabled Individuals who Offend - Sexually (ARMIDILO-S) is a comprehensive risk review and community management instrument designed for use with cognitively impaired adults. It was designed to assist support workers, case managers, guardians, home providers, clinicians and programme administrators in identification and management of risk for sexually inappropriate behaviour. The ARMIDILO-S is undertaken annually to assess if a client's risk profile has changed and to determine associated implications for management, whilst also allowing for reassessment of acute items as frequently as required to monitor ongoing risk.

The ARMIDILO-S is designed for males aged 18 years and older who have committed sexually offending behaviour and are either in the borderline region of intellectual functioning or are intellectually disabled and have committed sexually offending behaviour. Sexually offending behaviour is defined as any sexual action on the part of the individual that has been formally or informally sanctioned due to its inappropriate or illegal nature.

Professor Douglas P. Boer

Professor of Clinical Psychology, University of Canberra, Australia

Professor Boer began working at the University of Canberra in September 2012. From January of 2006 through to the end of August, 2012, he worked for the University of Waikato, Hamilton, New Zealand. Prior to 2006 he worked for the Correctional Service of Canada for 15 years in a variety of contexts including sex offender therapist and treatment programme supervisor. He has published a number of articles and structured clinical assessment manuals for use with sexual offenders, most notably helping to co-author the Sexual Violence Risk – 20 (the SVR-20) and the Assessment of Risk and Manageability for Individuals with Developmental and Intellectual Limitations who Offend - Sexually (the ARMIDILO-S).



Prof Boer continues to publish and present in the area of risk assessment of offenders. He is on a number of editorial boards, including: Journal of Intellectual and Developmental Disability, Sexual Abuse: Australia, New Zealand, the IATSO e-journal Sex Offender Treatment, The Journal of Aggression, Conflict and Peace Research, Journal of Criminal Psychology, and the British Journal of Forensic Practice.

Prof Boer is an active clinician, assessor, and clinical supervisor, working primarily with multi-diagnosed and/or brain-damaged and/or intellectually-disabled offenders.
