Confirmed speakers

Bryan Jepson, M.D. (USA) is best known to the autism community for his 2008 book "Changing the Course of Autism" an essential reference for both parents and physicians. This book is included gratis for each conference attender. His Children's Biomedical Center of Utah (a non-profit organisation) treated hundreds of children on the autism spectrum. He is now on the team at Thoughtful House in Texas.

Dr. Natasha Campbell - McBride, M.D. (UK) is the author of "Gut and Psychology Syndrome" (GAPS) which demonstrates the essential role of the gut in our mental health. She holds a Degree in Medicine and a Postgraduate Degree in Neurology and has also completed a Postgraduate Degree in Human Nutrition. At her Cambridge Clinic she specialises in nutrition for children with learning disabilities, and adults with digestive and immune system disorders. Her son, Nicholas was diagnosed with autism when he was 3 years old. Nicholas now attends a mainstream school.

Professor Boyd Haley (USA) returns to the UK after a fascinating presentation at the 2007 Treating Autism conference, Dr. Haley received a doctorate in Chemistry/Biochemistry at Washington State University. He has been a professor at the University of Kentucky since 1996. He was one of the first researchers to propose that the preservative Thimerosal in infant vaccines was the most likely toxic agent involved in Gulf War Syndrome and autism related disorders.

Karen DeFelice (USA) has worked in the areas of education and the sciences over 24 years. She is author of "Enzymes for Autism and other Neurological Conditions: The Practical Guide to Digestive Enzymes" and "Enzymes for Digestive Health and Nutritional Wealth". Her enjoyable down-to-earth style comes from first hand experience with chronic health issues in herself as well as her family and using enzymes as part of a total health solution.

Dr T. Michael Culp, MA, ND. (UK) is a world authority on Single Nucleotide Polymorphisms, more commonly known as SNPs (pronounced snips). More than 99% of human DNA sequences are the same; however, the variations, or SNPs, can have a major impact on how we respond to things such as viruses, toxins, bacteria, and other assaults. Dr. Culp will explain how to test for SNPs believed to play a role in autism and how this information can be used to make treatment decisions. Dr Culp has taught nutritional











biochemistry at Bastyr University and has lectured extensively.
