Research dissemination conference

This conference will share outcomes from SSAT's research into education for children and young people with complex learning difficulties and disabilities (CLDD). This research is supported by the Department for Education. They will examine the changing education needs of these children and will showcase online resources. The engagement-based materials, interventions and approaches emerging from this research have been developed by schools, for schools, with educators and multidisciplinary colleagues.

Ninety mainstream and special schools, academies and other settings, covering every age phase, have been research partners in this project. These include 15 international schools.
