### What is a Learning Disability?

A learning disability is a significant, lifelong condition including:

- Reduced ability to understand new or complex information or to learn new skills
- Reduced ability to cope independently
- A condition which started before adulthood (before the age of 18) with a lasting effect on the individual's development
- An IQ below 70

#### Who is in the Team?

All team members are health professionals, they offer:

- assessment.
- treatment and interventions.
- training,
- advice and support

to adults with a learning disability and their family / carers.



**Community Nurses** work with both children and adults. They offer support about physical and mental health, epilepsy and behaviour.



**Clinical Psychologists** offer support about learning, thinking, emotions and behaviour; including forensic issues, dementia, sexual abuse and parenting.



**Psychiatrists** offer support about mental health, epilepsy and behaviour.

All referrals must be made via individual's GP.



**Occupational Therapists** offer support about personal, domestic, leisure, work and community living skills. As well as environmental and equipment needs.



**Physiotherapists** offer support about positioning, walking, wheelchairs and other specialist seating and orthotics.



**Speech and Language Therapists** offer support about communication and eating, drinking and swallowing.



**Dieticians** offer support about nutrition and diet; including gastrostomy feeding.



**Art Therapists** offer support to express complex and difficult emotions through art.
