6. Review of international evidence on restraint.

The Youth Justice Board for England and Wales (YJB), the body which oversees the youth justice system in England and Wales, would like to invite you to consider taking part in a review of international evidence on restraint

We have recently commissioned an independent research team from Caring Solutions Ltd. and the University of Central Lancashire (UCLan) to undertake a review of evidence on restraint techniques employed within institutional settings, which do not rely upon or permit pain induction. The aims of the review are to: identify and review non-pain inducing restraint techniques currently employed across a broad range of settings and countries; and to assess their potential application to the youth custodial setting in England and Wales.

As an important part of this work, UCLan are conducting an online survey which will be used to capture information on techniques currently employed in settings across different countries. Respondents are also provided an opportunity to volunteer to take part in telephone interviews at a later date.

The YJB would like to invite you, a professional or expert who works in an environment where restraint techniques are employed, to kindly consider completing the survey.

The survey should take no more than **15 minutes** to complete, and we would be very grateful for views by **13th June 2014**.

7. How local learning disability communities rate themselves The Joint Health and Social Care Learning Disability Self-Assessment Framework

The Learning Disabilities Observatory, part of Public Health England has today published the first detailed report of the Joint Health and Social Care Learning Disability Self-Assessment Framework (JHSCSAF) that aims to provide accurate data about how local services are working together to tackle the needs of people with learning disabilities and the health and social care services available to support them across England.

On a national level, this information will support action that improves outcomes from people with learning disabilities and their families. On a local level, information collected will help Clinical Commissioning Groups and Local Authorities identify the key issues they need to tackle to reduce health and social care inequalities in their area. The framework also provides a robust way to benchmark services and monitor progress made locally.

Findings of the self-assessment ratings, made by Partnership Board areas, focus around 9 indicators each in the three key areas of staying healthy, being safe and living well.

About our project

This conference is part of our Department of Health-funded three-year project to raise awareness about epilepsy amongst hard to reach groups in north and east London. In these communities there is often a stigma surrounding epilepsy, coupled with little understanding or take-up of medical services, which results in poor management and emergency hospital admissions. Our project has introduced workshops amongst community and health groups to raise awareness, reduce fear and stigma, and to encourage access to local services. We have created a tailored self-management programme and a service user forum for people with epilepsy, and run stakeholder meetings in each of the six boroughs that help understand local needs. We have also produced new videos - 'All about epilepsy' – to help raise levels of awareness and understanding around the condition. The videos have been

dubbed into Bengali, Cantonese, Hindi, Somali, Turkish and Urdu. Throughout the project we have engaged with clinicians and health organisations, such as Clinical Commissioning Groups and Healthwatch. This conference is just one of three regional dissemination conferences we are running, which will be followed by a report to the Department of Health on local needs and recommendations for service improvements.
