The Confidential Inquiry

The Confidential Inquiry into the deaths of people with learning disabilities has reviewed the deaths of all people with learning disabilities in 5 PCT areas of England, over a two-year period (2010-2012). In order to place the findings of these reviews in context, a number of deaths of people who did not have learning disabilities have also been reviewed. The Confidential Inquiry will:

- Summarise the key findings about the circumstances leading to the deaths of people with learning disabilities;
- Draw out comparisons between the experiences of people with learning disabilities and people without learning disabilities;
- Consider where pathways of care could be improved, and share examples of where good practice has been evidenced;
- Reflect on the process of the Confidential Inquiry, and discuss whether the work could or should be taken forward into national surveillance work that monitors the causes of death of people with learning disabilities.

The Learning Disability Public Health Observatory

Referring to the findings from the confidential inquiry, the Learning Disability Public Health Observatory will examine how better information about the health and healthcare of people with learning disabilities can be used to improve health services and reduce the risk of premature death in the future. The Learning Disability Public Health Observatory will:

- Summarise the data that can now be collected nationally and locally, and explore what this can tell us about the health care people with learning disabilities are receiving;
- Discuss the research evidence available, and how this can be used to argue the case for better healthcare;
- Explore how some of the information collected by the Learning Disability Public Health Observatory has been implemented, and the implications for future practise;
- Describe the future arrangements for information gathering and sharing;
- The workshops will explore some of the themes above in more detail.
