

Understanding learning disability

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March 2007 saw the publication of "Death by indifference" a report by Mencap into the deaths of six individuals in our hospitals.



This prompted a National Independent Inquiry to be called for by the Secretary of State for Health; and the Health Service Ombudsman investigated these complaints independently. These reports will be published in early summer 2008.

In order that the messages can be disseminated a national conference is being hosted by South Staffordshire & Shropshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust. The date is 9th September and the venue will be in Telford, Shropshire.

Presentations will be made by the Healthcare Commission, Health Service Ombudsman, National Inquiry, Mencap.

At a time when many people are concerned about the increasing health needs of our population, this day will raise awareness as to the complexities faced by people with a learning disability and their families. Mainstream services are responsible for the provision of high class and equitable services for all people.
