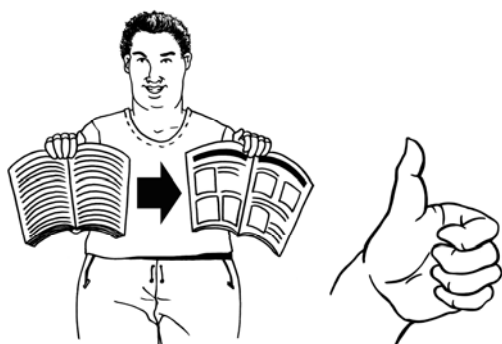


How to make information easy Training from CHANGE



This is a full-day training workshop delivered by **Trainers for Change**, people with learning disabilities employed at CHANGE.



The aim of the training is to make sure all people with learning disabilities get good access to information. Staff teams will learn how to use easy words and pictures to make their information accessible.



CHANGE has created Picture Bank CD's to support people to produce their own accessible information around being independent and everyday living issues.



By staff and people with learning disabilities taking part in training together everybody learns about:

- Better communication
- Using computer software
- Disability awareness
- Working in an empowering way
- People with learning disabilities having more control in their lives



The trainers in **Trainers for Change** make sure that everybody is able to take part and benefit from the training.

The group are experienced trainers able to create, develop and deliver excellent training sessions to influence staff training and policy-making.



By taking part in the training staff can contribute to the outcomes of people with learning disabilities achieving greater independence and having more choices in their lives.

Trainers for Change have:

- Trained Local Authorities to use accessible ways of working for all staff working with people with a learning disability.
- Trained Housing Groups to produce accessible information for their service users.
