



Communicating with people who experience severe / profound intellectual disabilities

This seminar will focus on an approach to communication known as **Intensive Interaction**

Intensive Interaction is an approach to assisting learners who experience Profound and Severe Intellectual and Multiple Disabilities to learn about and to become more successfully involved in social interactions, even though they may appear to have

extremely limited communicative behaviours. When the approach is used to underpin interactions with learners further isolated by Autistic Spectrum Behaviours it appears to contribute to a general shift from an inner to an outer, more social world.

Dr. Mark Barber has worked for over 20 years as a teacher with learners of all ages who experience Profound Intellectual and Multiple Disabilities; latterly he was a tutor at University of Manchester, UK. He has produced a number of publications on intervention approaches and early communication, including collaborations with Dr. Juliet Goldbart and Judith Coupe O'Kane. He is currently the Intensive Interaction Coordinator at Bayside SDS in Melbourne, as well as working with a range of agencies that provide services for learners with Profound Intellectual Disabilities in Victoria, SA, NSW & Queensland. Using video, activities and discussion, this very full programme is based on nearly 10 years of experience of using this approach in UK and Australia. Full references and resource lists will be given throughout the seminar and it is hoped that a network of interested practitioners might develop from the day.
