We are an independent social enterprise which makes a difference to people's lives through delivering training, demonstrating how everyone can contribute towards providing better support and improved services and true inclusion for all.

What we offer

We provide training on a variety of topics that are important to people with learning disabilities using a range of training methods including telling our personal stories and experiences, Power-Point presentations, interactive activities, group work, quizzes and games.

We train people with learning disabilities, people in mainstream services, and staff and managers who are working alongside people with learning disabilities. We can train any number of people - our university classes have 80 students! However, the smaller the group, the more that people can be involved. Our training for professionals includes Community Connecting, Person Centred Approaches and Right Support for People from the BME Community. A full list is available on our website.

Our peer training for people with a learning disability includes courses on Learn Something New! – about personal development, Being Safe in your Community, Living Healthily and an Equal Citizen course. We can deliver accredited training through the Open College Network (OCN).

As well as training, we do research projects, consultancy, facilitation, and user-led monitoring and evaluations.

Who are the trainers?

Training is led by a small team including people with a learning disability; all have extensive experience in the issues they deliver training on.
