Five key themes will run through the event.
Participants can follow one theme or move between them.

- **Community and organisational leadership - how leaders can operate in different ways to help achieve inclusion.**
- **Person centred approaches to public services – how the Government’s personalisation agenda can help to deliver inclusion.**
- **Jobs and work – at a time of recession, how to keep real paid jobs and staying in work, as a key part of contributing to society for everyone.**
- **Housing and home – strategies which promote equal access to housing and real control over both housing and support.**
- **Transition and life chances – ensuring that at key points in life (moving into adulthood, or older age, or in and out of care) community connections remain at the centre of service response.**

People, Lives and Communities is specifically designed for people in management, planning and leadership positions in statutory, voluntary and independent sector services whose role is to help achieve these outcomes.

We want to encourage small teams of people to come and work through issues together - teams that include ‘experts by experience’ so that older and disabled people and their families have their voice at the centre of the event.



Social inclusion

Supporting people to be full and equal members of their local communities, is at the centre of Government policy, in particular for people with disabilities, mental health problems and for older people.

For local authorities and ‘mainstream’ public services, the new ‘Duty To Involve’ places an expectation of effective engagement with excluded citizens and the delivery of better outcomes for older and disabled people.

For the health and social care system, the agenda is to move beyond traditional services to achieve community integration, so people have real jobs, their own housing and strong community relationships.

The core aim of this two-day conference is to bring together people, ideas and best practice from these two different perspectives to work through the policy agenda and the opportunities it brings.
