Background to New Types of Worker Programme

The white papers Our Health, Our Care, Our Say and Every Child Matters set out the agenda required to fulfil the vision for integrated services. The direction of travel for the social care workforce requires a fundamental shift in the way services are delivered. Options for Excellence helps us to develop a better understanding of the roles and tasks that are required to meet this challenge.

The New Types of Worker Programme commenced in 2003 and aimed to encourage a strategic approach to workforce development and a more integrated approach to service delivery. Twenty-eight local pilots were established to develop new approaches to service provision, identify and develop new worker roles in order to deliver these services. A wealth of learning and good practice has been developed during the pilot phase and a wide range of informative literature is available (see www.skillsforcare.org.uk)

Phase Two

Phase two of the programme began in October 2006 and aims to extend the learning and good practice from the pilot sites by establishing a sound evidence base upon which to embed good practice. This involves mapping initiatives which have resulted in new ways of working and new types of workers. This conference will raise the profile of new ways of working and will disseminate key messages to employers across the region.
