The Suffolk Accord

ACCORD stands for **A**dult and **C**hildren's services **Co**-ordination of services where a parent has a disability or additional support need.

The <u>Universal Protocol</u> (PDF, 344Kb) sets out Suffolk's co-ordinated approach to supporting families where a parent is disabled or has additional support needs.

The Protocol is accompanied by six sets of Practice Guidance to provide practitioners and managers with in depth information, tools and tips for effective practice and good outcomes around particular issues. There is a specific practice guidance document for staff working with families where a parent has a learning disability.
