



HELP AND ADVICE FOR LEARNING DISABILITY HEALTH COMMISSIONERS

As part of its response to the Independent Inquiry into the healthcare of people with learning disabilities, the Government undertook to create a Public Health Observatory for people with learning disabilities (PHO-LD). The two main aims of the PHO-LD are to:

- 1. Help stakeholder organisations make better use of existing information to improve the health and well being of people with learning disabilities
 - 2. Work with stakeholders to improve the nature and quality of future information

To share learning from the Public Health Observatory and local partners, we are running a series of five events across the country.

The events will assist commissioners to make use of information and learning about health checks, reasonable adjustments and data on the health needs of people with learning disabilities in England. The events will provide commissioners with tools and information to commission high quality, cost effective health services for people with learning disabilities. We will be sharing the latest reasonable adjustments data with participants, and will be asking for your experience of implementing reasonable adjustments, to help inform good practice guidance.
