ACHIEVING AGE EQUALITY IN HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE

We have a particular focus on equality and inclusion for older people who are disadvantaged or excluded from society, maybe because of their need for support, their age, race, disability or gender. All of our work is underpinned by strong values and evidence about “what works” in ensuring that older and disabled people are treated, not as passive recipients of services, but as full and active citizens with assets, gifts, talents and skills. New - Achieving Age Equality in Health and Social Care Birmingham, January 25th, £95 + VAT



NDTi takes a life course approach to ageing well – i.e. what happens to you throughout your life has an impact on life chances, health and wellbeing in later life. This has major implications for the way public services are commissioned and delivered, and how people of all ages think about preparing for their own later life.

We believe that age discrimination is pervasive within our culture, institutions and media and that to achieve a fundamental shift in thinking about age and preparing for an ageing society will require practitioners, providers and commissioners to adopt a very different approach to planning, delivering and providing local services.

We are offering a one day workshop that will address these themes, including:

- What do we mean by age discrimination? Developing a shared understanding of the issues and the uncertainties we face in this area.
- What does age equality in public service delivery look like?
- What tools are available to us in order to work towards achieving age equality in local goods and services?
- How do we measure the effectiveness of what we are doing?
- Action planning for the future.

RESEARCH & EVALUATION WORKSHOP

NDTi has a varied portfolio of research and evaluation work designed to inform and influence the nature of services and wider community supports to promote inclusive lives. These activities span short, medium and long term evaluations for government departments, grant giving bodies, local authorities, NHS organisations, the third sector and strategic partnerships. NDTi's approach to evaluation builds on Realist Evaluation methodology, which aims not just to answer 'is this approach / service working?' but also 'how is it working?', 'who is it working for?' and 'what are the critical factors that are needed to make it work elsewhere?' These questions have never been more pertinent than in the current economic climate.

We are offering one day, pay per place training events that aim to share NDTi's grounded experience in designing, conducting and learning from realist evaluation work. For those who really want to get under the skin of evaluation, NDTi also offer follow up training, including tailored evaluation capacity-building support for your organisation / partnership.
