## **BILD Annual Positive Behaviour Support Conference 2013**

### **Call for Workshop Papers**

#### **Introduction**

A popular event in the suite of events hosted by BILD, the National Positive Behaviour Support Conference is planned to be held on 9th and 10th May 2013 in the South of England.

It is anticipated that the 2013 conference will attract a wide range of professionals and individuals who have an interest in this field including people with experience of using services. BILD is keen to encourage presentations from people who have intellectual disabilities, their families and experience of using services.

The language of the event will be English

#### **Conditions of submission**

Before submitting an application, please ensure that if it is accepted for presentation you (all named authors and presenters), will be able to attend the whole of the event. We cannot offer provisional acceptance or make allowances for workshops to be delivered on a specific day, workshops will be allocated according to themes, to ensure that delegates can attend a range of workshops.

It is a term of submission and acceptance of workshops or poster session selected via the abstract submission process that all **presenters named in the submission abstract register for the conference**. It is expected that all speakers will be registered for the event by **30 January 2013** at the very latest. Failure to do so will lead to your inclusion in the event programme being withdrawn with immediate effect. Presenters of workshops will be expected to pay for a full delegate attendance at the event and will be responsible for all associated costs. It is hoped that BILD will be able to secure sponsorship to enable a number of presenters who have an intellectual disability and experience of services to attend the conference and deliver a workshop. At this time we cannot guarantee we will be in a position to offer free attendance to anyone.

Ensure that your abstract is relevant to one of the core themes of the event. The conference focus is positive behaviour support and reducing the use of aversive practices. All abstracts must be accompanied by a reference list of relevant research upon which the workshop will be based. All workshops must enable delegates to participate in the workshop.

BILD will accept submissions in other accessible formats such as DVD's, photos or drawings. Please give as much information as possible and remember to include and address where we can contact at least one of the abstract authors and presenters of the workshop.

## **Themes**

The focus of the event is Positive Behaviour Support. The focus will be to provide evidenced based information that can be used in practice. Themes will include;

12 October 2012 – Close of applications

30 November 2012 – Successful papers will be accepted by this date and confirmed.

**Please note papers that arrive after 24.00 GMT on 30th November will not be given consideration by the conference panel.**

## Guidance

- Use black typescript and use the abstract proforma provided by BILD
- Ensure the abstract is relevant to the conference themes and title
- Workshops will last 45 minutes to 1 hour and must be interactive for participating delegates. Ensure you explain in your abstract how participants will be involved in your workshop
- Clearly state the title of the workshop
- Clearly name all presenters
- Ensure you reference all relevant papers and research on which you have relied
- Ensure that the paper will be ready in full no less than one calendar month prior to the event. You will be expected to develop and make available all materials including the handouts and accompanying PowerPoint presentations (if appropriate to the workshop). These must be sent to BILD administrators one full calendar month before the event. Failure to do so will result in the workshop being withdrawn from the conference programme. Submission of an abstract indicates that you agree to your presentation being included in the conference report.


