

from hurting to healing

Generally offending behaviour is uncommon in people with learning disabilities but the incidence of sexual offending by men with learning disabilities has been found to be as high as four times that of non-learning disabled people. Sexual offending is mainly a young, male phenomenon, as it is in the general population and offenders tend to be solitary and functioning in the mild/borderline range of learning disabilities. In common with offenders without learning disabilities there is often a high incidence of adjustment problems at school, conduct disorder issues, mental health needs, organic brain damage and a family history of psychiatric disorder. It is notable that victims are more likely to have learning disabilities themselves and offenders are less likely to be gender specific in their victim choice. Early interventions are crucial in order to stop sexually harmful behaviours (SHB) being a stepping stone towards other offending behaviours.

As part of its pioneering work Respond's forensic services have been developed in order to understand offending behaviours in people with learning disabilities, to reduce risk and to help people to live their lives as independently and safely as possible. This seminar will consider some of the key issues in working with children, adolescents and adults who have sexually harmful behaviours and those that sexually offend.

This seminar will focus on forensic learning disabilities and Respond's pioneering work in the following areas:

- Risk assessment
- Children and Families: Assessment, Treatment and Safeguarding
- Forensic Psychotherapy
- Paraphilias and Paraphilia Related Disorders
