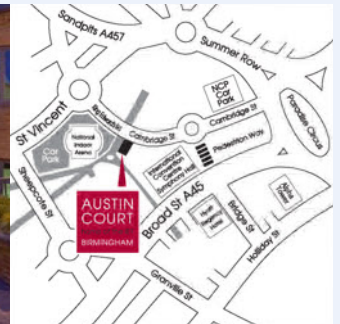

CONTENT

The workshop is aimed at people with a learning disability and staff who support them to think about what they need to do to set up and run a successful social business. There will be lots of activities and opportunities to share what you are doing and be given ideas on what you could do to develop your enterprise. It will cover all the main business issues such as legal issues and marketing that need to be considered when setting up a business with people with a learning disability.

A comprehensive workbook accompanies the workshop, as a resource to use after the event

This training event is suitable for staff who are supporting people with a learning disability, to set up a social enterprise and people with a learning disability are positively encouraged to attend too. The training is delivered through a mixture of presentations, group activities and handouts, and hearing the story of how Building Bridges Training developed. We can also come to your organisation

Building Bridges Training is an independent social enterprise which makes a difference to people's lives through delivering training. We are a group of experienced trainers, some with learning disabilities, who live in Sandwell, in the West Midlands.

We aim to demonstrate how everyone can contribute towards providing better support and improved services and true inclusion for all. As our name says we want to help build bridges so that people with learning disabilities can be more included in their communities.

Building Bridges Training is also able to offer all this courses as accredited awards with the OCN; Entry Level 3 for people with a learning disability and a Level 2 course for staff. This will require people to do additional work following the course, and developing a portfolio of evidence. There will be an additional cost to cover assessment and administration.
