Self injurious behaviour causes stress for people supporting individuals who exhibit it, because it is emotive and the behaviour can be resistant to change. We will explore the impact of self injurious behaviour on families, carers and employed staff and offer practical advice, solutions and an opportunity to discuss key issues for delegates.

This event is an opportunity to network, discuss and gain knowledge that will enhance practice within services and lead to the development of appropriate frameworks for supporting people who may be described as having or using challenging behaviour.
