A one day Conference in the Brighton Centre
Thursday 27th July 2006

Two recent Government reports, 'Opportunity Age' and 'A Sure Start to Later Life' have set an ambitious and challenging agenda to reform public services and public attitudes towards older people and ageing.

As part of the Brighton & Hove "Celebrating Age" festival, a national conference is being held for participants to **hear about the policy from those who made it, **debate** the rhetoric and the reality, **challenge** stereotypes and **discuss** how to make it happen at regional and local levels.**

The day will be highly participative and focused on achieving tangible outcomes for older people.

Aims of the Day:

- **Provide an opportunity to hear about this crucial national development agenda from policy makers, government department heads and public service leaders – and those responsible for making it happen on the ground**
- Create an environment of open and honest debate about the rhetoric and the reality of the Sure Start model, and approaches for working with excluded older people
- **Challenge and explore the stereotypes of "excluded older people" and identify the barriers and the levers for positive change for individual older people and local populations**
- Use the South East Region as a focus of discussion for exploring implementation opportunities and challenges
