School of Social Sciences and Philosophy Department of Economics

Lectureships in Economics (2) (permanent)

Salary: €35,718 - €72,085 / €74,486 - €81,874 per annum

The posts will be tenable from 1st September, 2007. The successful candidates will be expected to contribute to core courses in the Department's four-year honours degree and one-year MSc programmes. These include microeconomic and macroeconomic analysis, mathematics, and statistics. Current priority areas include microeconomics courses, and at least one of the appointees will be expected to contribute to applied econometrics courses at the undergraduate and postgraduate level. Although applications from all fields will be considered, applications from these areas are strongly encouraged. The appointee will also take on various administrative responsibilities.

The ideal candidates for the posts will have: a PhD in Economics; experience in teaching and dissertation supervision; the potential to establish a strong research and publication record, and to generate research funding and research synergies linking with the Department's focus on international economics and applied economics.

School of Nursing and Midwifery

The School of Nursing and Midwifery's strategic vision incorporates ambitious plans to enhance research output through the increase of research funding (over €3m in past 5 years), and research student numbers. Whilst applications are welcome from scholars in every area of health care research, the School seeks to make appointments in fields that build on the School's existing research strengths in the areas of ageing and disability, maternity care and women's health, and encourage development in other emerging areas including mental health.

Lecturer in Psychiatric Nursing (3-year contract)

Lecturer in Nursing or Midwifery (3-year contract)

Candidates must be registered nurses or midwives with a relevant postgraduate qualification, preferably at PhD level, a background of teaching and course administration in nursing or midwifery, and experience of post-graduate supervision. Appointees will be expected to teach and administer courses at all levels, to engage actively in research, and to be successful in attracting research funding as part of a team.

The appointments which are tenable from 1st September 2007, will be offered on the Lecturer salary scale (€35,718 - €81,874) per annum at a point to accord with qualifications and experience. Appointments will generally be made in the commencing range (€35,718 - €72,085) per annum, but in exceptional cases may be made at the full range of the salary scale.

Clinical Tutors (3) (permanent)

Clinical Tutors will be required to teach in practice, clinical skills laboratory and classroom settings for 9 months of the year, from September to June (start and finish dates negotiable). School of Chemistry

New national initiatives between the Health Services Executive and the University of Dublin, Trinity College have resulted in the creation of these new posts.

Practice Education Coordinator (permanent) Regional Placement Facilitators (permanent and 3-year contract)

The Practice Education Coordinator role is to co-ordinate, strategically manage and develop the quality and capacity of practice education for Occupational Therapy students. The appointee will work closely with Occupational Therapy Managers and Practitioners, the discipline of Occupational Therapy and relevant professional bodies.

Based in College, Regional Placement Facilitator posts will have responsibility for the support of practice education for students within a particular geographic area. The appointees will work in partnership with the Practice Education Coordinator, the discipline of Occupational Therapy, Occupational Therapy Managers, Practitioners and students, and will ensure quality and capacity.

The appointees will also provide guidance and support to Practice Educators within a geographic area, consequently candidates will be required to travel between placement sites. Flexible working hours will be considered.

Appointees for all posts will report to the Head of Occupational Therapy.

The successful candidates will demonstrate excellent communication and organisational skills, together with a high level of self direction and flexibility. Candidates must have three years' full time post qualification practice experience, and have experience in working with students in practice. Postgraduate qualification is desirable. Applicants should be eligible for membership of the Association of Occupational Therapists in Ireland.

Salary will be related to the HSE Senior Occupational Therapist scale, commensurate with qualifications and experience to date (€49,819 - €58,973 per annum.)
