National Workshop

Recent research and reports such as **Death by Indifference** (Mencap 2007) indicate that there is still much to do to ensure Acute hospitals are able to deliver accessible, safe and supportive care for all patients with learning disability.

The Valuing People Support Team would like you to join us at this is event that aims to share existing good practice in this area, to generate ideas for improvement and to specifically consider the key supporting role and work of Acute Liaison Nurses.

There are three key questions we'd like to explore:

1. What is the role of Learning Disability Liaison nurses? (LDL)

- What sort of posts are they in? What role do they play in these posts?
- Do LDL nurses have a training role?
- How common are LDL nurse posts? What is their geographical spread?
- What triggers the involvement of an LDL nurse in an individual's case?

2. What is the ideal recommendation(s) the independent inquiry could result in for LDL nurses?

- What evidence is there of the impact of LDL nurses on the care received by people with a learning disability in the NHS?
- Where, in what posts, and with what responsibilities would LDL nurses be in the best place to improve the healthcare treatment of people with a learning disability?

3. What impact could LDL nurses have had on the six cases in *Death by indifference*?

- If LDL nurses had been in place when Emma, Mark, Martin, Warren, Ted and Tom were ill, what do they imagine they would have been able to do?
- Would LDL nurses have had an advocacy role if they had been involved in any of the six cases?

We'd also like to find out what the LDL nurses think is needed to improve the situation for people with a learning disability in the NHS more generally.
